Synergy

Synergex release new runtime system 9.1. This new version supports MS Windows 2008 Server and MS Windows 9 for client workstations. All airports will be upgrading to this new version in the first half of 2011.

AUG

The ALDIS User Group was hosted by Exeter International Airport in October 2010.

The next ALDIS User Group will be hosted by Gloucestershire Airport in November 2011. Both the C.A.A. and N.A.T.S. will be attending as honorary members. It is expected that all airports using AIS software will attend.

New VAT Rules

New VAT rules were required to handle aeronautical billing from 1st of January 2011. This involved modifying both the credit and cash invoicing modules. The new rules stated that VAT would be charged to all operators on any weight of aircraft unless a valid VAT exempt certificate was granted to the operator. The old rules based on weight band still applies for all military and government aircraft.

Gate Guardian

AIS has further developed it's Security Sentinel software to allow the checking of web boarding passes at the boarding gate. The software also keeps track of all passengers on a specific flight departing at a gate and displays any missing passenger(s) by name that have been through security but failed to turn up at the gate.

The software also takes care of multi-sector flights and updates the passenger information into the AFIDS software.
